### LLANO CO-OPERATIVE COLLEGE STANDARDS:

The college has only a very few regulations such as are absolutely essential to successful school work, which are as follows:

1. All Grade and High School Students are required to observe the 7 o'clock Study Hour at home

or in their rooms. Permission to be absent during the Study Hour will be given only upon request of the parents, if students are living at home. The Study Hour is 10:30, at which time all lights are out.

2. The use of tobacco in any form by Grade and High School students under 18 years of age is prohibited. In no case is tobacco permitted in or near the school buildings.

3. No parties or social occasions in which students participate are to be conducted or attended without permission of the Superintendent, and an approved Chaperone. Dances outside the College are not attended by the students.

4. Profane and improper language or conduct of any kind are strictly forbidden, and all students are to be courteous and respectful to their teachers, foremen, and other associates at all times.

5. Students who fail to give honest and satisfactory service in the industries will be required to continue their duties under the same foreman all of the next day following their failure.

6. Absence from class means a reduction in the rating of the student and will influence the grade in the course accordingly. The maximum number of absences allowed is ten per cent of the number of class periods in one Term. Three tardinesses shall be counted one absence, and absences immediately preceding and following holidays shall double.

7. All parents and members of the Llano Co-operative Colony, by their Colony Pledge, are committed to co-operating with any necessary regulations and their full co-operation in these standards of student conduct is therefore required and expected. Any criticism of the school is to be made to the management in charge, rather than to others who are not in a position to control matters.
